BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill **September 25, 2014**

The Board of Trustees met in regular session on Thursday, September 25, 2014 at The Carolina Inn, Chancellor's Ballroom. Chair Caudill presided and convened the meeting at 8:00 a.m.

Chair Caudill read the annual ACC Governing Board Certification for the 2014-2015 school year. A motion was made by Trustee Grauer to approve the certification, it was seconded by Trustee Shuping-Russell, and passed.

CHAIR'S REMARKS

Chairman Lowry Caudill presented the following remarks:

- Welcomed Debbie Dibbert to her first meeting as the Chancellor's new Chief of Staff.
- Reiterated the four goals set in July:
 - Support Chancellor Folt and her senior leaders as they become a highly effective operational team.
 - Accelerate, measure and communicate the growth and economic impact of our innovation and entrepreneurship initiatives.
 - Tell our story: Carolina improves the lives of people across North Carolina, our nation, and our world; and
 - Implement the work of the two trustee task forces on enterprise risk management and external relations.
- Highlighted three significant events since the last meeting:
 - o The successful rollout of the revised policy on sexual violence and discrimination.
 - UNC-CH came in #1 among top-flight public universities in the New York Times economic diversity ranking showing the proportion of undergraduates receiving Pell grants and net price.
 - Lastly, commented on the Chancellor's opinion column published by U.S. News and World Report on the future of American higher education.
- Thanked Trustee Stone for representing the Board at last week's C-STEP kickoff event.
 This program allows low- to moderate-income students who transfer to Carolina from a partner community college.

REMARKS FROM THE STUDENT BODY PRESIDENT

Andrew Powell, Student Body President presented remarks on the following:

- Since the last meeting, Mr. Powell has spent time speaking at convocation, parents weekend and many other events around campus
- Commented on his student government team. He mentioned Brent Comstock who leads the student government tech team, takes classes, and runs a 15 person company back home
- Recently, Mr. Powell, the Chancellor and other staff from the university went to Athens, Georgia on the Chapel Hill Chamber of Commerce Intercity Visit.
- Altogether, there are more than 200 students involved in student government.
- Student Government has been working closely with faculty, graduate student leadership and fellow undergraduate students on a number of things:
 - They have added a student-athlete to the Student Advisory Committee to the Chancellor
 - They have worked with Joy Renner and the FAC to have Benton Moss, a pitcher on the Carolina Baseball team, to attend those meetings
 - Lastly, they have a student from the football team leading an athletics group within student government.
- Student Government has partnered with the Royster Society of Fellows on the Stigma Free Carolina Campaign
- Spoke about funding issues with the SafeWalk program and said that it has been sustained
- Mr. Powell has commissioned a task force chaired by Student Body Vice President Kyle Villemain to document the current student landscape for innovation and entrepreneurship and recommend ways to bridge any gaps that exist for student

ventures.

- Spoke about blended learning and the work of the Online Task Force
- Thanked Chancellor Folt and Steve Farmer for attending the event at the Campus Y to discuss need-based aid and Carolina's commitment to meeting 100% of demonstrated need.
- Lastly, Mr. Powell thanked Trustee Shuping-Russell and Trustee Lerner and the students from the Sierra Student Coalition for their work together to find a forwardlooking solution to sustainable investment of endowment funds.

CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

Chancellor Folt spoke on the following:

- Theme of today's presentations: innovation in the class and in the world
- Chancellor Folt shared some "behind the scenes" stories:
 - She attended the Council on Competitiveness along with NC State Chancellor Randy Woodson to talk about innovation
 - Attended the annual C-STEP kickoff event
 - Honored 20+ year survivors of HIV/AIDS
 - o Ebola preparedness
 - Preparations for the release of the Wainstein report as well as implications for the NCAA investigation
 - PeopleSoft/ConnectCarolina launch on October 1, 2014
- In the news, the Chancellor commented on the recent #3 ranking for economic diversity in the New York Times
- U.S. News & World Report ranks UNC-CH as the 5th in the country among all publics
- Chancellor Folt has been facilitating a national discussion on higher education with pieces in the Wall Street Journal and U.S. News & World Report
- Carolina was mentioned in more than 1,000 positive national and global media stories.
 This includes Dr. Bill Fischer for his work in West Africa, Dr. Kelly Hogan and her
 research on flipped classrooms, and Professor Steven King who helped to create a
 website to track Ebola cases for the Liberian government.
- In FY 2014, faculty at Carolina brought in more than \$790 million in research contracts and grants. Nearly \$15 million more than FY 2013.
- Today, Chancellor Folt announced that the National Longitudinal Study of Adolescent Health, or Add Health, has been granted \$28 million from the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute of Child Health and Human Development. This is the nation's longestrunning study on health of adolescents and their transition into early adulthood. Chancellor Folt also acknowledged principal investigator and director Dr. Kathleen Harris.
- There are at least 150 UNC-CH start-ups here in North Carolina that provide jobs to nearly 8,000 North Carolinians.
- Chancellor Folt commented on the improved, comprehensive policy on addressing sexual violence.
- There are nearly 4,000 first-year students and more than 800 transfers in this year's class. 18% are first generation college students, 14% graduated as valedictorian or salutatorian, and they represent 94 N.C. counties, 38 states, and 24 countries. There are also more than 2,300 new first-year graduate students.
- Over the past year, UNC-CH has hired 177 new faculty members.
- Chancellor Folt mentioned the Carolina Performing Arts 10th Anniversary Gala

happening on Saturday and also University Day that will occur on October 12th.

- Commented on the ALS Ice Bucket Challenge.
- Introduced Dean Karen Gil to introduce the first presenters, Dr. Michael Crimmins and Dr. Kelly Hogan.
- Introduced Provost Jim Dean to introduce Dr. Susan Cates.
- Introduced Dean Bill Roper to introduce Dr. Billy Fischer.

ENGAGING TOMORROW'S SCIENTISTS

Dean Karen Gil introduced the first presenters: Dr. Mike Crimmins, Mary Ann Smith Distinguished Professor of Chemistry, and Dr. Kelly Hogan, Senior Stem Lecturer. Dr. Crimmins and Dr. Hogan presented on innovative teaching methods and course re-design in large gateway science courses. The goal of the AAU Undergraduate STEM Initiative: UNC-CH Project, co-directed by Dr. Crimmins, is to transition large science courses in Chemistry, Biology and Physics into high-engagement, student-centered learning environments. Since implementation of the project the achievement gap of these courses have dramatically improved across all student populations. Three students joined Dr. Hogan and Dr. Crimmins to tell of their experiences in the classes and as student mentors. To conclude their presentation Dr. Hogan, Dr. Crimmins and the students entertained questions from the trustees.

MBA@UNC

Provost Jim Dean introduced Susan Cates, Executive Director of MBA@UNC and President of Executive Development at Kenan-Flagler Business School. Before they started the MBA@UNC program they wanted to answer one main question: "Can we create a comparable program for students who cannot come to Chapel Hill?". They made a promise to have the same level of students, same faculty, and the same Chapel Hill education. Since its inception in 2012, the program has had a 96% retention rate and enrollment has steadily risen. To conclude her presentation, Mrs. Cates entertained questions from the trustees.

THE STRUGGLE TO CONTAIN EBOLA

Dr. Bill Roper, Dean of UNC School of Medicine introduced Dr. William Fischer, Associate Program Director for Research in the Department of Medicine's Division of Pulmonary Diseases and Critical Care. Dr. Fischer presented on the current struggle to contain Ebola in West Africa. In June, Dr. Fischer was asked by the World Health Organization to help work on emerging pathogens and he has been sent to Guinea to work with Doctors without Borders to try and help reduce mortality form Ebola virus in rural communities. Dr. Fischer gave a comprehensive update on Ebola from how it is transmitted to the current state of Africa. To conclude his presentation, Dr. Fischer entertained questions from the trustees.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (University) recognizes the University's role in seeking solutions to global issues using the educational, research and financial resources of the University; and

WHEREAS, through the investment of the University's endowment funds the University can influence the development of environmentally friendly alternative energy sources; and WHEREAS, investing in the development of environmentally friendly alternative energy sources promotes economic growth, energy independence and environmental and public health.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Trustees of The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill requests that UNC Management Company, research targeted investments for the University's endowment assets that advance environmentally friendly clean energy strategies consistent with applicable asset allocation and investment objective policies.

WHEREAS, Kevin Seitz provided eight months of steady leadership and outstanding service to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill as Interim Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration and Chief Financial Officer until Matt Fajack's arrival in June 2014;

WHEREAS, the University was extremely fortunate to have, in Associate Vice Chancellor for Finance Seitz, such a capable professional in charge of finance and administration operations during a significant transition period in South Building and for the Division of Finance and Administration;

WHEREAS, Chancellor Carol L. This procedure outlines the guidelines and procedures for requesting "out-of-cycle" increases to base salary for EPA Non-Faculty employees. "Out-of-cycle" increases are any adjustments to base salary excluding adjustments accomplished as part of the normal EPA annual raise process (ARP), a salary supplement (which is not part of base pay) or from a job change resulting from a competitive recruitment or waiver of recruitment. Out-of-cycle requests should be non-routine in nature and must have a specific and detailed justification. The following are justifiable reasons to propose an out-of-cycle salary adjustment:

- To recognize permanent, newly added **additional duties** which are substantive in nature; temporary additional duties are compensated using an administrative salary supplement and not a permanent adjustment to base salary. In the case of newly added duties, the duties in question should be demonstrated to substantially increase the scope and complexity of the employee's position. Minor changes in duties and responsibilities should be addressed in the ARP process. A Position Modification must be completed in EPAWeb Position Management prior to OHR approval of salary adjustments based on additional duties.
- To address documented salary **equity** issues including those caused by the salary of a newly appointed employee within a work unit. Equity may be used when a new hire has been appointed at a higher salary rate than existing employees in the same classification within a particular unit, department, or division. Justification for an increase due to internal equity must identify the inequity and justify the rate of increase based on the relative job level, education, credentials, and/or experience of the affected employees.
- To address job equity in comparison to market or "labor market". **Labor** market is defined as the area within which employers compete for labor. The market is composed of those institutions, businesses and organizations from which University units recruit or would logically recruit. Justification for an increase due to labor market/external equity must be substantiated by market survey data. **(Labor market increases must be paid from non-state funding sources)**
- As a **retention** offer for an employee who has a documented, confirmable salary offer from an outside institution. In instances where an offer has not been presented, departments must be able to demonstrate that the intended salary increase recipient is considered a finalist for the external position. Justification for an increase due to retention should include an assessment of the individual's merit and value to the institution and the circumstances warranting a retention adjustment.

PROCESS AND APPROVALS

- Out-of-cycle requests must be documented on the <u>FY 2013/14 SPA and EPA Salary Adjustment/Supplement form</u>. This form, in Microsoft Excel format, should be emailed to the EPA Non-Faculty HR unit at <u>epanfsalaryrequest@unc.edu</u>.
- Any permissible base salary increase as listed above (regardless of the amount) for an EPA Non-Faculty employee requires pre-approval of the Vice Chancellor and/or Associate Vice Chancellor for Human Resources.
- Chancellor pre-approval is required if the cumulative amount of all of the employee's increases fiscal year-to-date is 10 percent or higher of the prior June 30 total compensation. The Office of Human Resources also reports to the Office of the Chancellor, on a weekly or biweekly basis, all increases which fiscal year-to-date are less than 10 percent of the prior Jun 30 total compensation.
- Board of Trustees (BOT) approval under our normal procedures is required if the cumulative amount of all of the employee's increases fiscal year-to-date is 10 percent or higher of the prior June 30 total compensation.
- Board of Governors (BOG) pre-approval is required if the cumulative amount of all of the employee's increases fiscal year-to-date is 10 percent or higher of the prior June 30 total compensation, which includes base pay and salary supplements then in effect. This pre-approval requirement applies not just to base salary but to all forms of temporary compensation (e.g. salary supplements, acting pay, stipends, and lump sum payments) for any **permanent** employee when the temporary compensation shall either exceed nine months in duration and 10% of the prior June 30 total compensation or 25% of the prior June 30 total compensation, regardless of duration.
- EPA Non-Faculty salary increase effective dates may be no earlier than the first of the month in which the proposed increase receives its final required approval.

Notes

- 1. Pre-approval for any temporary employee salary increase exceeding the 10% threshold is required by Campus HR (VC/AVC for Human Resources)
- 2. Pre-approval is required for individuals employed by other state agencies or UNC campuses and newly hired at UNC CH with an increase from their current base salary
- 3. An employee who is being rehired following prior service in FY11/12, may not receive an increase upon reemployment unless they are returning to a position with a documented increase in duties
- 4. Requests for post-docs must follow the same criteria/justifications for increases listed above. Pre-approval for any increase exceeding the 10% threshold is required by Campus HR (VC/AVC for Human Resources)
- 5. Temporary or interim increases that are will be in place 9 months AND are 10% or greater of the June 30 salary require pre-approval
- 6. Temporary increases of 25 % or greater of the June 30 salary requires pre- approval regardless of duration
- 7. An employee in a temporary job is subject to the same general salary increase prohibitions as a permanent employee
- 8. Course overloads are considered task-based compensation and are not included in the 10% pre-approval process
- 9. Retention Employee must be actively considered for an outside opportunity, or compelling retention risks exist based on the external market for hard-to-fill or unique skill sets.
- 10. Additional Duties: Duties should be demonstrated to substantially increase the scope and complexity of the employee's position. Minor changes in duties and responsibilities should be addressed in the ARP process. A Position Modification must be completed in EPAWeb Position Management prior to OHR approval of salary adjustments based on additional duties.
- 11. Equity Adjustment: Justification for an increase due to internal equity must identify the inequity and justify the rate of increase based on the relative job level, education, credentials, and/or experience of the affected employees.
- 12. Labor Market: Labor market is defined as the area within which employers compete for labor. The market is composed of those institutions, businesses and organizations from which University units recruit or would logically recruit. Justification for an increase due to labor market/external equity must be substantiated by relevant market survey data.

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Faculty Salary Increases and Tenure Promotions

Tenure Promotions

- **1.** The process begins in the Schools with a faculty vote.
- 2. Next, the dossier packet moves to the Dean of the school for his/her review and support.
- 3. Then the dossier moves to the Arts and Sciences Advisory Committee (ASAC), for the College of Arts and Sciences, to the Health Sciences Advisory Committee (HSAC), for any of the health affairs areas, or directly to the Appointments Promotions and Tenure committee (APT) for all other schools. For those going through HSAC or ASAC, if they are approved, they are forwarded to APT.
- 4. The APT committee reviews all promotions and makes a recommendation to the Provost.
- 5. The Provost then reviews and if he approves makes a recommendation to the BOT.
- **6.** BOT reviews.

Faculty Salary Increases

- 1. Schools submit salary increase requests of 10% or greater to the Academic Personnel Office (APO) for review.
- 2. If all of the process has been correctly done by the schools, APO submits the requests to the Provost for his review.
- **3.** If the Provost approves, he submits them for review to the Chancellor.
- **4.** If Chancellor approves, the requests are moved to the BOT.
- **5.** If BOT approves, the requests move to the BOG.

The BOT reviews and approves increases of 10% or more in salary. The BOG now also reviews and approves increases of 10% or more in salary. Note, faculty increases of less than 10% pass through the EPAweb system for review and approval by the APO office.
