

## 2018 Accomplishments


- Members are better informed
  - Increased time spent briefing members on current priorities and initiatives
- Members are more engaged
  - Recruited 82% of members to join a BoV committee AND engage in at least one other meaningful activity
    - ✓ Help their School or program
    - ✓ Support the alumni association
    - ✓ Become more active donors
- Members are given a way to stay engaged once they leave


- Federal Funding at UNC-Chapel Hill
  - Student Aid
  - Research
- FY 2018 Omnibus
- FY 2019 Appropriations

#### **Federal Student Aid Dollars**

- UNC-CH distributes approximately \$205.3 Million
- 12,600 students receive federal aid
  - 8,300 undergraduate students
  - 4,300 graduate students
- Federal Grants: 4,100 students
- Federal Loans: 5,800 students

#### **Federal Research Dollars**

#### Research Funding Sources (FY 2017): Federal Sources



**Total Federal Funds: \$637 Million** 

#### FY 2018 Omnibus

- On March 23, Congress passed FY18 omnibus appropriations bill
- Massive 12 Appropriations bills
- Funded the federal government to the end of the current fiscal year: September 30, 2018.
- Substantial increases

### FY 2018 Omnibus

### **Department of Education (ED):**

- The Pell Grant program: maximum award raised to \$6,095 (+\$175) for the 2018-19 school year.
- Federal Work Study (FWS): \$1.13 billion (+14%)

### FY 2018 Omnibus

- National Institutes of Health (NIH)
  - \$37.084 billion, an increase of \$3 billion (+9%)
- National Science Foundation (NSF):
  - \$7.67 billion (+ 4%)
  - Research & Related Activities: \$6.3 billion (+\$301 million)
- United States Agency for International Development (USAID):
  - \$1.6 billion (decrease of \$24 million)

## **FY 2019 Appropriations**

- Return to Regular Order?
- Minibus 5 bills
  - (1) 3 bills: Energy and Water, Military Construction-VA, and Legislative Branch
  - (2) 2 bills: Labor-Health and Human Services-Education and Defense
    - Continuing Resolution (CR) through December 7 (remaining 7 bills).

## **FY 2019 Appropriations**

- Department of Education (ED):
  - Pell Grant: increases the maximum Pell Grant award to \$6,195 (+\$100)
- National Institutes of Health (NIH):
  - \$2 billion increase
- Department of Energy (DOE):
  - Office of Science: \$325 million increase (+5.2%)
  - Advanced Research Projects Agency (ARPA-E):\$13 million increase (+3.6%)
