





How are we doing?

Over the past two decades, we have dramatically increased the percentage of the class who are NC residents and either have a top test score (1450+ SAT or 32+ ACT) and/or who are ranked within the top 3% of their graduating class.

For the past decade we have consistently maintained 1/3 market share of the top 3% of graduates in all of North Carolina.

What we need help on

- Raise additional funding four-year renewable scholarships, flexible scholarships, study abroad opportunities, and research opportunities.
- Identify opportunities for student internships and better highlight how Carolina prepares for next steps.
- Expand partnerships with external foundations to enhance recruitment to Carolina based on the entire university experience





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
