WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees last amended the *Trustees' Regulation on Honorary Degrees* at its meeting on March 25, 2021, through a Substitute Amendment attached hereto as Exhibit A;

WHEREAS, by resolution in September of 2021, the Board of Trustees temporarily suspended the applicability of certain amendments made on March 25, 2021 for awards not yet selected, until June 30, 2022 or until otherwise modified or rescinded by subsequent board action, whichever was sooner;

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees wishes to further temporarily suspend the applicability of those amendments;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees temporarily suspends the applicability of the amendments made to Section 3 of the *Trustees' Regulation on Honorary Degrees* for awards not yet selected, until June 30, 2023 or until otherwise modified or rescinded by subsequent board action, whichever is sooner.


Its mission is to use hip hop art and culture to promote cultural exchange, entrepreneurship, and conflict transformation in underserved communities around the world
