

WUNC Coverage Map






WUNC Donors


- 44,347 households donate to WUNC

FY22 Operating Expenses Total \$11,702,331



- Returns invested in capital projects, collaborations, and acquisitions




NEW CASH & COMMITMENTS










FUNDRAISING & EXPENDITURES (3-year average)





EXPENDITURE Per Advancement FTE




